## Brief description of the care home

Caversham is a small care home set in a residential area of Witcombe on the outskirts of Gloucester. The home is close to a local shop. The single bedrooms with ensuite toilets are located on the ground and first floors, with a bathing facility available on the first floor. There is a sitting room at the front of the house with a dining room and kitchen combined at the rear. The residents also have the benefit of a garden at the rear of the house. Current fees are GBP329.60 to GBP414.65. Hairdressing, chiropody and newspapers are charged extra. The home makes information about the service, including inspection reports available to residents and their representatives through a service user guide and statement of purpose available in the home.

## **What we found:**
